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You are invited to complete a learning needs analysis survey as part of the Rural and Regional Health Partnerships Learning Needs Analysis Project. The project is endorsed and funded by the Barwon South West CEO Council which covers a range of health services in the Barwon South West Region.

Aim

The aim of the Rural and Regional Health Partnerships (RRHP) Learning Needs Analysis Project is to better understand the learning needs of nurses, midwives and allied health staff employed in the Barwon South West Region (BSW). The project will inform a strategy to address the education and training needs of staff across the region to strengthen workforce capability. Secondary aims of the project are to reduce duplication of education and training programs and to address the inequities in the access and provision of education and training across the Barwon South West Region.

Who can participate?

All nursing, midwifery and allied health staff employed at a participating health service within the Barwon South West Region are invited to complete the Learning Needs Analysis Survey. Invitations to participate will be sent to the email address linked to your Learning Management System (e.g. Grow) account. Completing the survey is voluntary. The project officer will not know who has, or has not completed a survey and individual responses will not be identifiable.

How to participate?

If you are a nurse, midwife or allied health staff member employed at a participating health service, you will receive an email inviting you to complete the survey. The survey may also be completed by using the QR scanning code found at the end of this document. If using the QR scan code, you can complete the survey on your phone or tablet.

The survey will take approximately 15 minutes to complete and will cover three sections:

- 1. About you
- 2. Interprofessional learning needs questions
- 3. Your specific learning needs

You will be asked to respond to questions such as:

What is your profession?

What are the barriers that have impacted you when trying to access education / CPD activities?

You will also see statements that relate to a range of skilled activities, many of which you undertake when performing your role. You will be asked to rate your perception of each activity in relation to (a) how relevant the activity is to your current role and (b) how well you currently perform that activity. Examples include:

Confidently record relevant and timely information in the consumer's record

Monitor the consumer's response to treatment / intervention

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As this survey is designed for use by many professions, the activities are those expected of all clinicians as per the Health Workforce Australia Common Capability Resource. The activities have also been mapped against the NSQHS Health Service Standards and Aged Care and Quality Standards.

Risks and benefits to you

Apart from the time it will take you to complete the survey, we do not foresee any risks to you. Your involvement is voluntary. This is your opportunity to have a voice and shape the way education and training is planned, developed and delivered across the Barwon South West Region.
